Key Vocabulary

- **Emergency:** when something serious happens that you were not expecting that is a big problem.
- **Hero:** Someone who is brave, kind and helpful. A person who does amazing things for other people
- **Tools:** Something you use your hands to work that helps you do a job like gardening or building.
- **Uniform:** Clothes that you wear to a job to show what you do.
- **Vehicle:** A machine used for moving people or things like an ambulance or a fire engine.

Key Locations

- **Fire Station-**This is where the fire engines are kept and the different teams, or 'watches' stay when there isn't an emergency. Ours is near to Homebase!
- **Doctor's Surgery-**This is where you go to see the doctor if you are poorly. Where is yours?
- **Police Station-**This is where police work if there is not an emergency. We have a huge one in Brighton near the pier!

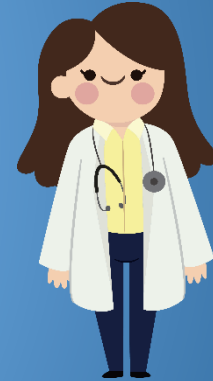
